

The temple was accidentally discovered on 11 December 2009 during land excavations to lay foundations for the construction of the new university main library. Kimpulan Temple was buried about five metres underground.

University at a Glance

PIONEER OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN INDONESIA

The passion to establish a higher education institution in Indonesia that would provide students' with outstanding academic background along with Islamic knowledge started even when the nation was born. In 1945, a general assembly meeting of the Masjoemi (Majelis Sjoero Moeslimin Indonesia) was held. The meeting was attended by some of the leading political figures of the day including Dr. Mohammad Hatta (the first Vice President of Indonesia), Mohammad Natsir, Mohammad Roem, and Wachid Hasyim. One of the decisions of this meeting was the establishment of Sekolah Tinggi Islam (STI – Islamic Higher School) by those leading figures, who became the institution's founders.

UIN was founded on 8 July 1945 and became the pioneer of national higher education in Indonesia. Initially UIN had four faculties: Religion, Law, Education, and Economics. UIN was forced to close due to the Dutch military invasion in 1947. Many students and staff members joined the Indonesian military force to repel the Dutch invasion. In the early 1950s, shortly after the war, UIN had to move its classes from place to place around the city of Yogyakarta, even using part of the Sultan's Palace and some of the faculty members' houses as classrooms.

UIN had undergone improvements between 1961-1970 under the leadership of Prof. Mr. R.H.A. Kasmat Bahuwinangun (1960-1963) and Prof. Dr. dr. Sardjito (1964-1970). During his term in office, UIN developed Faculty of Islamic Studies and Faculty of Tarbiyah as well as expanding to Purwokerto to establish The Faculty of Law and Shari'a.


From 1964 to 1970, under the leadership of Prof. Dr. dr. Sardjito (a leading medical doctor in Indonesia), UIN expanded to 22 faculties, five located in Yogyakarta and the rest were scattered in four provinces: Central Java (Solo, Klaten, and Purwokerto); East Java (Madiun); West and North Sulawesi (Gorontalo). The areas of study offered were Economics, Law, Islamic Law (Syari'ah), Islamic Education (Tarbiyah), Engineering, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, and Pharmacy. However, when government regulations prevented UIN from maintaining educational activities outside Yogyakarta, UIN had to close its branch campuses. Some of them became associated with local institutions.

In the early 1970s to 1982, UIN saw extensive physical development of its offices and faculty buildings, followed by the construction of three other campuses located throughout the city. Since 1990, UIN has located its new main campus at Kaliurang km 14.5 Yogyakarta. Built on 35-hectare of land, our campus standing on a hillside became the largest and the most stunning in the north side of Yogyakarta.

The Strategic Direction 2018-2022 set by the Board of UII Waqf Foundation mandates the development of universities that are directed to enhance international reputation/recognition which is built on competitive advantage (innovation), quality management, and organizational values that are based on four institutional capabilities: leadership, resources/capital, content, and process/system. The main theme that frames the UII Strategic Plan 2018-2022 was inspired by the Qur'an, Q.S. Ibrahim (14) 24-25.



Students can easily find convenient places to meet with friends, held a study group, or attending various public events such as seminars, festivals and arts performances. The city also provides various facilities to support the learning needs of students such as the city library, bookstores, internet cafes, copy centers and stationeries. To enjoy a relaxing time on the weekend, you can visit the shopping center, cinemas, and a variety of entertainment and fun hangout places. Wherever you come from, you will find and feel Yogyakarta as your second home.

Accommodations

Home of over one hundred higher educational institutions, with student coming from all over the country and abroad, Yogyakarta is a great "campus" for multi disciplinary scientific discourses and cross-cultural interactions. Such a dominant presence of students influences the cost of living in Yogyakarta, which is relatively inexpensive compare to the living cost in other major cities in Indonesia.

We understand that proper accommodation plays an important role in supporting the comfort of living and academic success for our students. A wide choice of boarding or rented house with variety of rental rates and facilities can be found easily around campus UII. Affordable accommodation is another reason why people choose this city for studying and living.

On-Campus Accommodation

Accommodation facilities owned by UII currently provided for students receiving scholarships from Pondok Pesantren UII and used interchangeably for religious training activities (PNDI and LKID). These campus accommodation are located in two locations as follows:

- **Pondok Pesantren UII Putra (Male Students Boarding School)**, located in Jl. Selokan Mataram, Condongcatu, Depok, Sleman, Yogyakarta. This campus dormitory has 33 rooms which accommodate 66 students. The location of this dormitory is close to the downtown, with a range of 2 km distance to Campus Condongcatu (Faculty of Economics), approximately 9 km to Taman Siswa Campus (Faculty of Law), and approximately 14 km to the Main Campus.
- **Pondok Pesantren UII Putri (Female Students Boarding School)**, located in UII Main Campus, this student dormitory provides 24 rooms with a capacity of 60 students.
- **UII Student Dormitory**, located in UII Main Campus and currently used as a temporary boarding facility for conducting Pesantrenisasi for new students, and other religious training activities. UII student dormitory has a total of 48 rooms with the capacity approximately 300 people.

Off-Campus Accommodation

There are many accommodation facilities are available around UII campus. Students can choose to rent a room (kost), or rented house with several rooms that can be shared with a few friends. Off-campus accommodation fees are vary depending on location and amenities provided.

Transportation

In addition to convenient access from other major cities through Adisutjipto International Airport, Tugu and Lempuyangan Train Stations, as well as Giwangan and Jombor Bus Stations, Yogyakarta also has reliable city transportation. Students can easily access the city bus transportation (Trans Jogja), using motorcycle taxi (ojek) or calling for a cab. However, private motorcycles and cars are the most widely used by students.

Food

Various kinds of amenities at affordable prices can be found easily throughout Yogyakarta at stalls, mini markets, malls or even the local traditional markets. Food can also be found without difficulty at street food stalls, cafes, and

restaurants. Asides from providing Yogyakarta traditional cuisine, various traditional dishes from all over Indonesia and international cuisine are also available.

Study Support Facilities

Various support facilities such as telecommunications, libraries, book stores, photocopy centers, computer stores, and electronic peripheral stores are available in Yogyakarta. Postal delivery and international fund transfer will not be a problem as post offices and banks can be found in every subdistrict.

To escape from routine academic activities, Yogyakarta offers many recreational options, shopping destination, and beautiful temples and beaches to visit.

International Mobility Program

BECOMING GLOBAL CITIZENS

Aspiring to be a world-class university, UII develops extensive networks with prominent universities across the world. At this moment, UII has many active international partners that collaboratively develop various mobility programs.

P2A Green Growth and Eco-Innovation

Universitas Islam Indonesia, Telkom University, and Mapua University jointly held a passage to ASEAN (P2A) virtual journey program with the theme "Green Growth and Eco-Innovation" on September 3-28, 2020. The P2A virtual journey was designed to enrich students' school life experiences, deepen students' cross-cultural skills & global mindset, build student relationships and strengthen students' global awareness. This program was participated by 50 students from the three institutions.

Tailored Programs with Nanjing Xiaozhuang University, China

Uii and Nanjing Xiaozhuang University (NXU), China, have collaborated on some online tailored short programs implemented in 2021, such as 'Design Thinking in Education,' conducted on 9-19 July 2021, and 'Global Outreach Program between China and Indonesia.' These programs were credited programs in NXU, aimed to provide students with global experiences related to Indonesia's language and culture, introduction to Indonesia and Yogyakarta, several thematic class sessions, virtual visits to tourist objects, and Indonesian foods. The two programs were participated by 30 students from some study programs at NXU.



Summer Camp: Indonesian Heritage Story

Indonesia has been known for its unity in diversity. This unique legacy is being nurtured by its society, having a lot of diversity of culture, beliefs, traditions, languages, arts, and typical buildings. The rich of culture of Indonesia inspired Universitas Islam Indonesia (UII) to develop a short program on the topic "Indonesian Heritage Story (IHS)" that provided opportunities for the participants to learn and experience in-class and outdoor activities regarding the topic.

The IHS 2022 targets international students to study in Indonesia at a certain time, especially the ones who visit Indonesia for the very first time. We expect that the IHS 2022 will be their "First Door" in visiting Indonesia so that they will have a brief experience and overview of Indonesia.

In line with the theme "Preserving Our Heritage," this program is designed to invite the participants to look at their neighborhoods and preserve the cultural heritage that we have in our home country. This offline program was successfully implemented on 2-5 August 2022, and participated by 20 students from Malaysia, the United Kingdom, Vietnam, and the Philippines.


BUiLD - Building Universities in Leading Disaster Resilience (2019-2022)
